## **Promethazine**

Additional Names: Phenergan

Classification: Antiemetic

Indications: Nausea and Vomiting and N/Vrelated to narcotic administration

Contraindications: Known hypersensitivity

Glaucoma Hypocalcemia

Dosages: 12.5-25 mg IV/IM, may repeat to a max dose of 50mg, to be diluted in 10cc NS

Pediatric dose: (>2yo) 1 mg

Side Effects: Blurred vision

Slow or fast heart rate Respiratory depression

Dry mouth Dypsnea Altered LOC Seizures Drowsiness

**Physiological Effects:** Blocking histamine (allergic reaction). Binds to H1 receptors

instead of histamine to help reduce allergy symptoms and works on parts of the brain that control nausea and vomiting.

**Additional Info:** Promethazine should not be used in children less than two years of age. Slow or shallow breathing that can lead to death may occur.
