## **SUCCINYLCHOLINE**

Additional Names: Suxamethonium, Anectine

Classification: Neuromuscular Blocking Agent

Indications: Pharmacologically assisted endotracheal intubation

**Contraindications:** Known Hypersensitivity

CVA or spinal cord injury within the last 6 months

Chronic renal failure on hemodialysis

Suspicion of hyperkalemia

Known or suspected muscular disease (e.g. ALS, muscular dystrophy,

myasthenia gravis, Guillain-Barre syndrome)

History of malignant hyperthermia

Dosages: Adult:

<u>Delayed & Rapid Sequence Intubation (if approved by agency's Medical Director)</u>

2 mg/kg IV/IO

**Side Effects:** Excessive salivation, muscle fasciculations, rise in intracranial, intraocular, intragastric

pressure. May cause rhabdomyolysis.

Depolarizing muscle relaxant.

**Additional Info:** Rapid onset of action (45-60 sec). Duration 5-10 min. Do not use to maintain paralysis.
